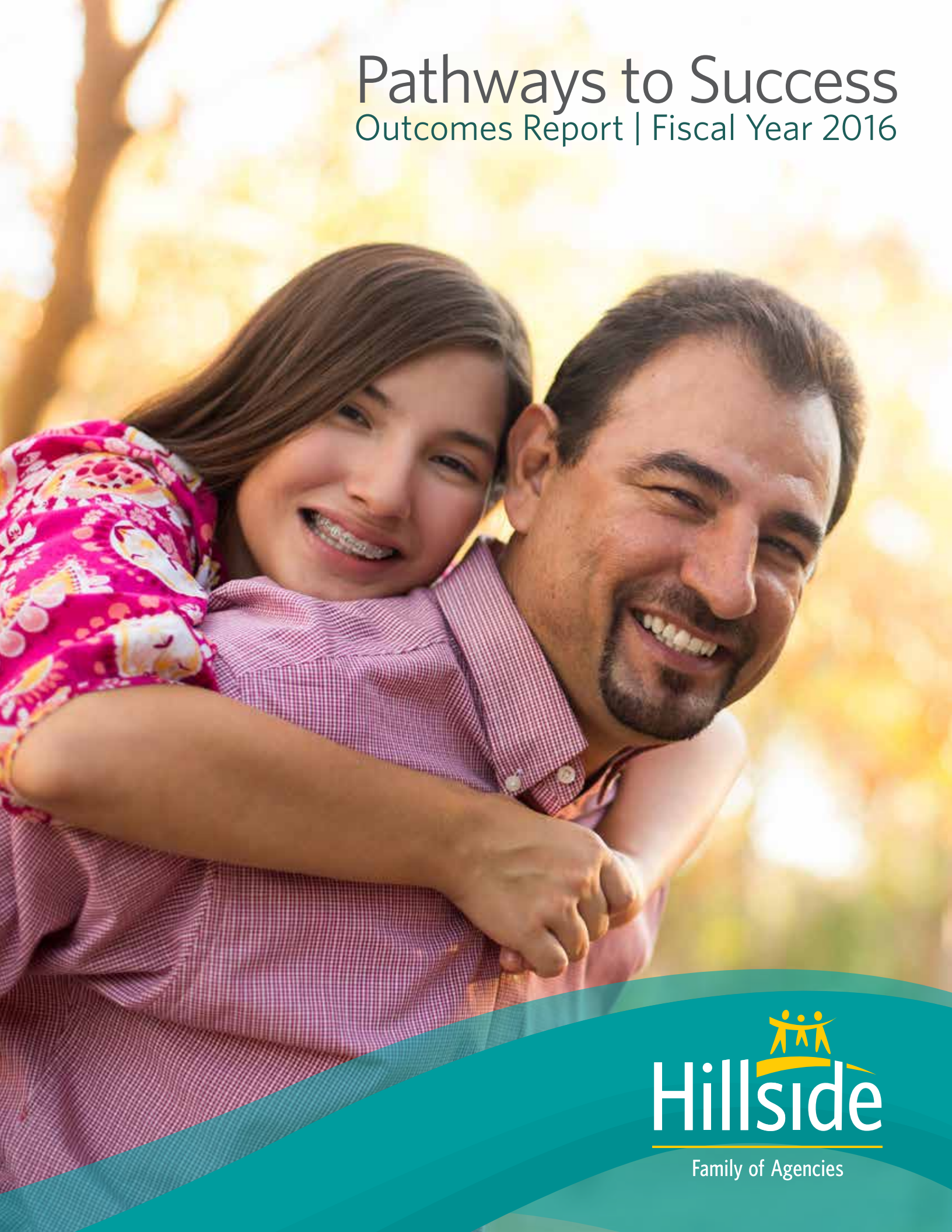

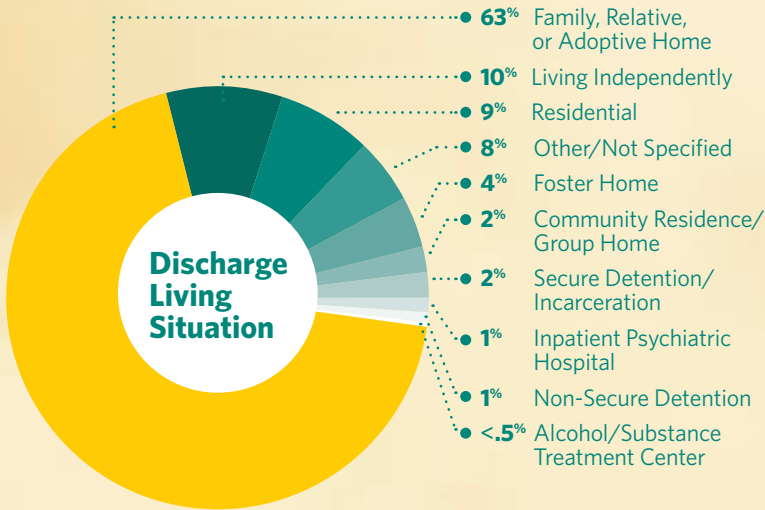

Discharge Living Situation**

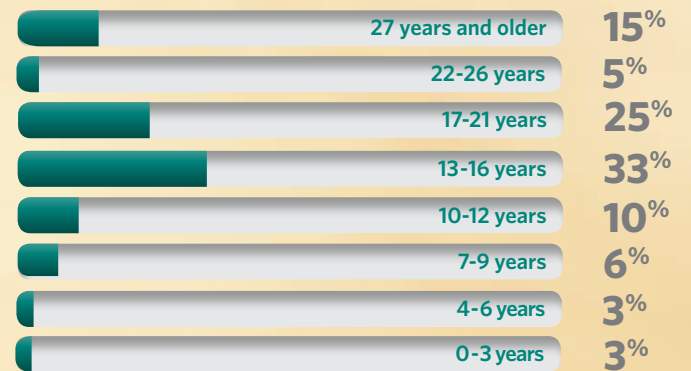


Discharge living situations are a key indicator of permanency, the ideal condition for children as they develop into adulthood. Youth are best served in their homes, families and communities.

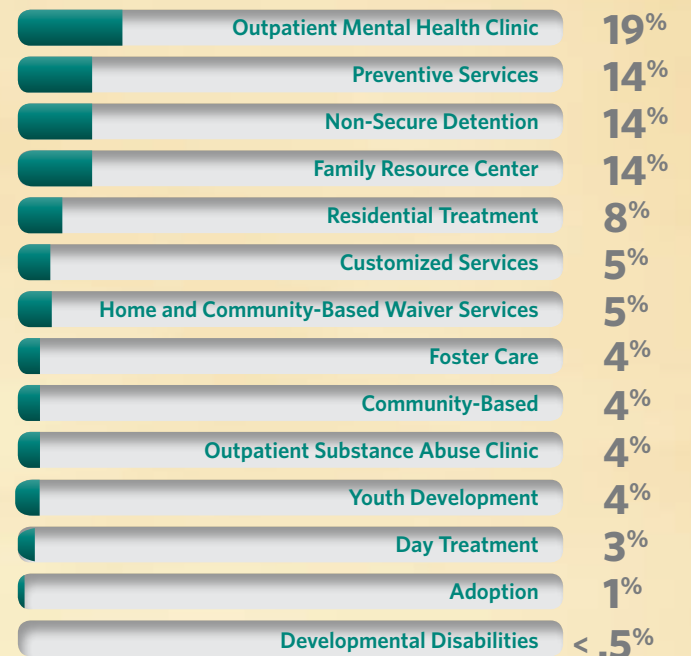
Youth Discharged by Gender



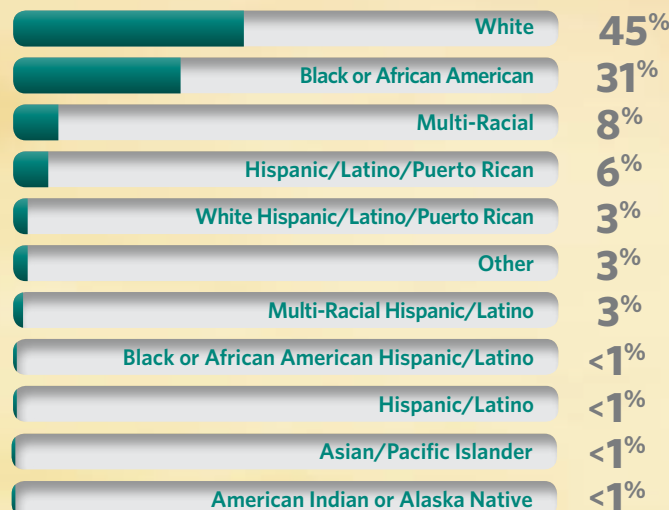
Youth Discharged by Age

Youth Discharged by Ethnicity

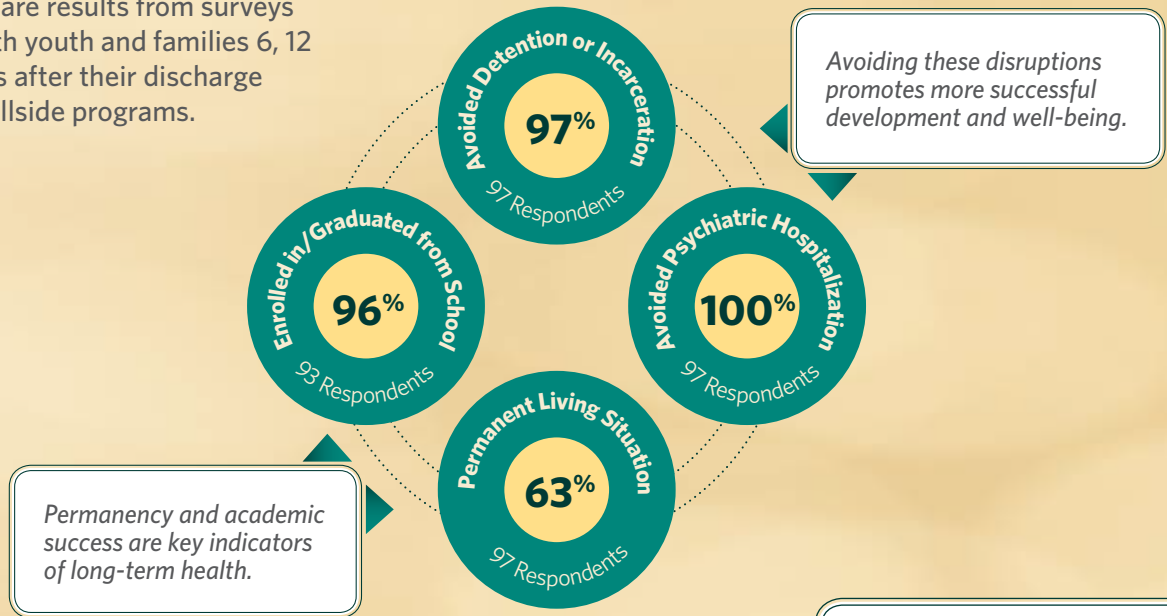

The following are results from surveys conducted with youth and families 6, 12 and 18 months after their discharge from select Hillside programs.

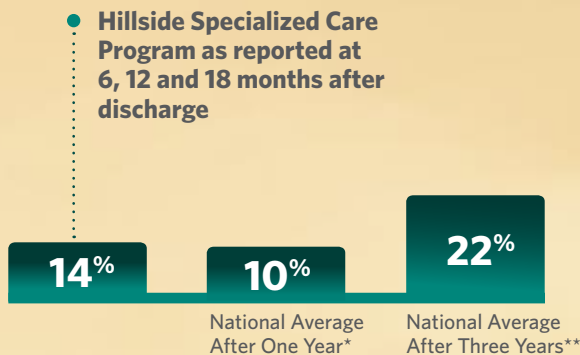


Improving the Future of Youth

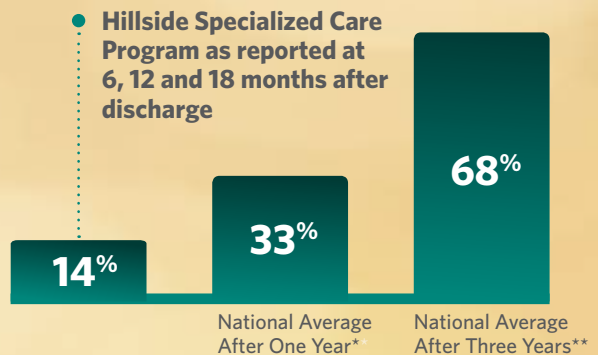
Hillside programs provide youth with pathways to safe and healthy lives in their families and communities.

Specialized Care programs provide trauma-informed residential treatment for youth displaying sexually harmful behavior. Because Hillside serves a small number of youth in these programs, a single recidivist (illegal) incident can shift outcome percentages significantly.

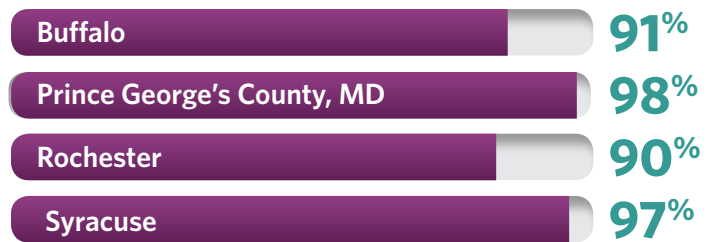
Graduation. College. Career.

Hillside Work-Scholarship Connection's outcomes are distinct from other Hillside services.

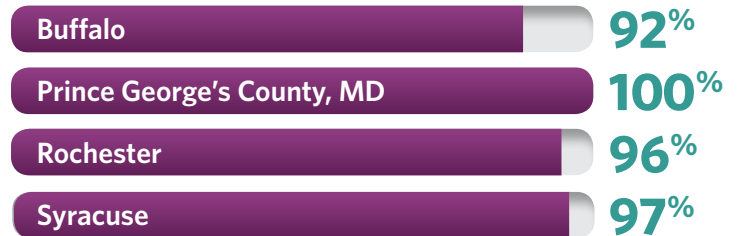
The program delivers coordinated support—in collaboration with youth, families and school districts —that helps students achieve their goals of a high school diploma, along with college-prep and employment training that opens doors to a lifetime of success.

Among high school seniors who stay with the program beginning in Grade 9, high graduation rates are the norm in all regions.

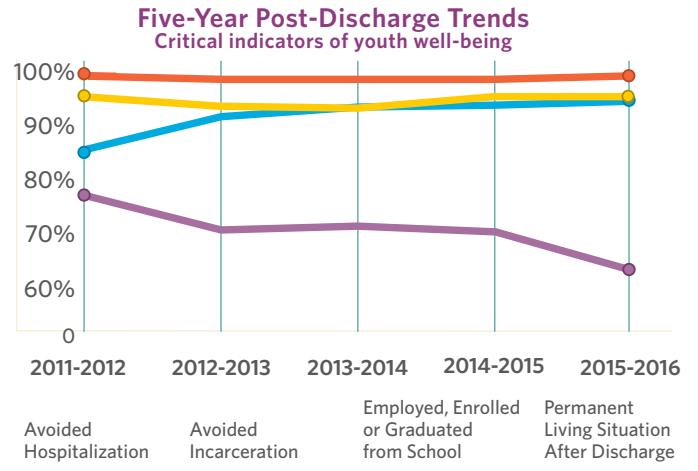
